<p>Luke 9:20-23 <sup>20</sup>"But what about you?" he asked. "Who do you say I am?"</p> <p>Peter answered, "The Christ of God."</p> <p><sup>21</sup>Jesus strictly warned them not to tell this to anyone. <sup>22</sup>And he said, "The Son of Man must suffer many things and be rejected by the elders, chief priests and teachers of the law, and he must be killed and on the third day be raised to life."</p> <p><sup>23</sup>Then he said to them all: "If anyone would come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me."</p> <p>Mark 15:25-27; 33-37 <sup>25</sup>It was the third hour when they crucified him. <sup>26</sup>The written notice of the charge against him read: THE KING OF THE JEWS. <sup>27</sup>They crucified two robbers with him, one on his right and one on his left... <sup>33</sup>At the sixth hour darkness came over the whole land until the ninth hour. <sup>34</sup>And at the ninth hour Jesus cried out in a loud voice, "Eloi, Eloi, lama sabachthani?"—which means, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"</p> <p><sup>35</sup>When some of those standing near heard this, they said, "Listen, he's calling Elijah."</p> <p><sup>36</sup>One man ran, filled a sponge with wine vinegar, put it on a stick, and offered it to Jesus to drink. "Now leave him alone. Let's see if Elijah comes to take him down," he said.</p> <p><sup>37</sup>With a loud cry, Jesus breathed his last.</p> <p>2 Cor. 5:21 For God made Christ, who never sinned, to be the offering for our sin, so that we could be made right with God through Christ.</p>
